

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GENERAL INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

This device is a 40W LED GOBO Projector that includes with 1 glass GOBO and 4 metal GOBOs. Users can also manually control the beam angle, focus, and framing shutters. Compatible with the UC IR wireless remote.

UNPACKING

This device has been thoroughly tested and has been shipped in perfect operating condition. Carefully check the shipping carton for damage that may have occurred during shipping. SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Be sure the voltage of the power source matches the required voltage of the unit.
- Disconnect from main power before making any type of connection.
- Do not remove the cover for any reason. There are no user serviceable parts inside.
- Always be sure to mount this unit in an area that will allow proper ventilation. Allow approximately 6.8' (2.1 meters) between this device and a wall.
- To reduce the risk of electrical shock or fire, do not expose this unit to rain or moisture.
- This unit is intended for indoor use only. Use of this product outdoors voids all warranties.
- During long periods of non-use, disconnect the unit from power.
- Always mount this unit in safe and stable matter.
- Power Cord Protection Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the fixture.
- Do not attempt to remove or break off the ground prong from the electrical cord. This prong is used to reduce the risk of electrical shock and fire in case of an internal short.
- A safety cable of the appropriate weight rating should always be used when this fixture is installed in a suspended location.
- The fixture should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - A. The power cord or the plug has been damaged.
 - B. Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into, the appliance.
 - C. The appliance has been exposed to rain or water.
 - D. The fixture does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance.




Caution! DO NOT stare into the beam, RG2



The luminaire should be positioned so that prolonged staring into the luminaire at a distance closer than 2.1 m is not expected.

Backup-restraint string should be used: made of steel, min. diameter 2.5mm.

ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS

A qualified electrician should be used for all electrical connections and/or installations.

DO NOT INSTALL THE FIXTURE IF YOU ARE NOT QUALIFIED TO DO SO!

Fixture MUST be installed following all local, national, and country commercial electrical and construction codes and regulations. Before rigging/mounting the fixture to any metal truss/structure or placing the fixture on any surface, a professional equipment installer MUST be consulted to determine if the metal truss/structure or surface is properly certified to safely hold the combined weight of the fixture, clamps, cables, and accessories.

Overhead fixture installation must always be secured with a secondary safety attachment, such as an appropriately rated safety cable that meets all local, national, and country codes and regulations.

Fixture should be installed away from walking paths, seating areas, or areas where unauthorized personnel might reach the fixture by hand.

NEVER stand directly below the fixture when rigging, removing, or servicing.


Allow approximately 15-minutes for the fixture to cool down before servicing.

The unit should be mounted using a mounting clamp (not provided), and affixing it to the mounting bracket that is provided with the unit. Always ensure that the unit is firmly fixed to avoid vibration and slipping during operation. Always ensure that the structure that you are attaching the unit to is secure and is able to support at least 10 times the unit's weight. Also, always use a safety cable that can hold 12 times the unit's weight when installing the fixture. The equipment must be installed by a professional, and it must be installed in a place where it is out of the reach of people's grasp.

INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

CLAMP INSTALLATION

This device features an attachment point for a mounting clamp located on the top of the mounting bracket, as well as a loop for a safety cable located on the rear panel (see illustration below). When mounting the fixture to a truss or any other suspended or overhead installation, align the hole on an appropriately rated clamp (not included) with the hole on the fixture's bracket, then insert a bolt of the appropriate size and rating through the hole and secure in place with an appropriately rated nut. Attached a SAFETY CABLE of the appropriate rating to the provided attachment loop.


RIGGING

Overhead rigging requires extensive experience, including but not limited to: calculating working load limits, understanding the installation material being used, and periodic safety inspection of all installation material and the fixture itself. If you lack these qualifications, do not attempt to perform the installation yourself. Improper installation can result in bodily injury.

INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

FIXTURE INSTALLATION

This device is fully operational in three different mounting positions: hanging upside-down, mounted sideways on trussing, or set on a flat level surface. Be sure this fixture is kept at least 0.2m (7.9in.) away from any flammable materials (decoration etc.). Always use and install the supplied safety cable as a safety measure to prevent accidental damage and/or injury in the event the clamp fails. Never use the carrying handles for secondary attachment.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

On-Board System Menu. This device features an easy to navigate system menu, with the functions of each command in the system menu detailed below. Please read the next section thoroughly!

To access the main menu press the MODE button, then press the UP or DOWN buttons until you reach the function you wish to change. Press the SETUP button to confirm. When a function is selected, use the UP or DOWN buttons to change the function settings. Once your changes are made, press the SETUP button, and then press and hold the MODE button for at least three seconds to confirm and lock the change into the system memory. If the MODE button is not pressed and held within eight seconds, the fixture will automatically confirm and lock the change into the system memory. To exit without making any changes, press the MODE button.

DMX SETTINGS - DMX Address:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "DMX Settings" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "DMX Address," then press SETUP.
- 3. The current DMX address will now flash on the display screen. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to find your desired address. Press SETUP to set your desired DMX address.

NOTE: If the unit does not go into DMX mode after you connect your DMX controller, press and hold the MODE button for at least 3 seconds.

DMX SETTINGS - Channel Mode:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "DMX Settings" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Channel Mode," then press SETUP.
- 3. The current DMX channel mode will now flash on the display screen. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to find your desired channel mode, then press SETUP to confirm.

DMX SETTINGS - Black Out / Hold / Pri Sec (No DMX Setting): This setting controls how the fixture will behave when the DMX signal is lost or interrupted.

- Press the MODE button until "DMX Settings" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll until either "Black Out", "Hold", or "Pri Sec" is displayed. This setting control how the device will behave when the DMX signal is lost or interrupted, and the currently selected option will be displayed. Press SETUP.
- 3. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to scroll through the options, then press SETUP to confirm. The available options are as follows:
 - Black Out takes all channels to zero.
 - Hold holds most recent settings.
 - Pri Sec defaults to primary/secondary mode.

PERSONALITY - Pri Sec:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Pri Sec Mode," then press SETUP.
- Press the UP or DOWN buttons to toggle between Primary and Secondary mode, then press SET-UP to confirm your selection.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

PERSONALITY - Dimmer Mode:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Dimmer Mode," then press SETUP.
- 3. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to scroll through the following options: Standard, Stage, TV, Architectural, Theatre, and Stage 2 (see the **Dim Curves** section of this manual for detailed information). Press SETUP to confirm the choice displayed on the screen.

PERSONALITY - IR: Use to activate or deactive the remote control function.

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "IR," then press SETUP.
- 3. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to toggle between On (remote control function activated) and Off (remote control function deactivated), then press SETUP to confirm your selection.

PERSONALITY - Display - Saver Delay: The unit's display screen will go into screen saver mode after the unit is inactive for the selected period of time.

- Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Display," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Saver Delay", then press SETUP.
- 4. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to set the amount of time the unit will be inactive before the screen goes into screen saver mode. Selectable options are "Off" or 1 to 10 seconds. Please note that when the "Off" option is selected, the screen will never go into screen saver mode.

PERSONALITY - Display - Screen Lock: The unit's screen controls will lock after the unit is inactive for the selected period of time.

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Display," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Screen Lock", then press SETUP.
- 4. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to set the amount of time the unit will be inactive before the screen controls lock. Selectable options are "Off", 30 seconds, or 1 to 10 minutes. Please note that when the "Off" option is selected, the screen controls will never lock. To unlock the screen, press and hold the MODE button for 3 seconds.

PERSONALITY - Display - Rotate:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Display," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Rotate", then press SETUP.
- 4. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to toggle beween "dISP" (normal display orientation) and "dSIP" (inverted display orientation). Press SETUP to confirm.

PERSONALITY - Temperature Unit:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Temperature Display," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to toggle between C and F, then press SETUP to confirm your selection.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

PERSONALITY - Service: Use this setting to restore the unit to factory settings.

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Personality" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Service," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to key in the password (011 by default), then press SETUP to confirm.
- 4. When the screen displays "Factory Restore", press SETUP to enter the sub-menu.
- 5. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to toggle between "Yes" and "No". "Yes" resets all unit settings to factory default, and "No" returns you to the previous menu without making any changes.

MANUAL CONTROL - Dimmer:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Manual Control" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Dimmer," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to the desired dimmer setting. Selectable values range from 000 to 255. Press SETUP to confirm your selection.

MANUAL CONTROL - Strobe:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Manual Control" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Strobe," then press SETUP.
- 3. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to the desired strobe setting. Selectable values range from 000 to 255. Press SETUP to confirm your selection.

INFORMATION - Fixture Life Hours: Displays the number of hours the device has been powered on during its entire lifetime.

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Information" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Fixture Life Hours," then press SETUP. The screen will now show the number of hours the device has been powered on during its entire lifetime.
- 3. Press SETUP to return to the previous menu.

INFORMATION - LED Usage Time: Displays the number of hours the LED has been powered on.

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Information" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "LED Usage Time," then press SETUP. The screen will now show the number of hours the LED has been powered on.
- 3. Press SETUP to return to the previous menu.

INFORMATION - Firmware Version:

- 1. Press the MODE button until "Information" is displayed, then press SETUP.
- 2. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Firmware Version," then press SETUP. The screen will now show the current software version of the fixture.
- 3. Press SETUP to return to the previous menu.

PRIMARY SECONDARY CONFIGURATION

This function allows you to link units together to run in a Primary-Secondary set-up, in which one unit will act as the controlling unit and the others will react to the controlling unit's built-in programs. Any unit can be configured to act as a Primary or as a Secondary, but only one unit in a given system can be programmed to act as the Primary.

Primary-Secondary Connections and Settings:

- 1. Daisy chain your units via the XLR connectors on the rear panels of each unit. Use standard XLR data cables to link your units together. Remember that the male XLR connector is the input and the female XLR connector is the ouput. The first unit in the chain (primary) will use the female XLR connector only. The last unit in the chain will use the male XLR connector only.
- 2. For the unit that will be set as the primary, press the MODE button to navigate to Personality > Pri Sec Mode, then press SETUP. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to toggle this setting to "Primary", then press SETUP to confirm. Finally, set the unit to the desired operational mode.
- 3. For any unit(s) that will be set up as a secondary, press the MODE button to navigate to Personality > Pri Sec Mode, then press SETUP. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to toggle this setting to "Secondary", then press SETUP to confirm. The unit should now follow the primary unit.
- 4. Make sure that only one unit is designated as the Primary, while all other units are designated as Secondaries.

REMOTE OPERATION

The **UC IR** remote (sold seperately) has many different functions and allows you to control your device at a distance of up to 30 ft.

STAND BY - This button blacks out the fixture.

FULL ON - This button has no valid function for this fixture.

STROBE - Press and hold this button to activate strobing.

FADE/GOBO - This button has no valid function for this fixture.

"DIMMER +" and "DIMMER -" - Use these buttons to adjust the output intensity.

1-9 - These buttons have no valid function for this fixture.

SOUND ON & OFF - These buttons have no valid function for this fixture.


SHOW - This button has no valid function for this fixture.

WIRELESS DMX INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

For best results, position the fixture so that the display screen is oriented in the direction of the transmitter device or remote.

Wireless signal can penetrate walls, glass, metal, and most objects. However, there are many factors that can effect and/or interrupt the wireless signal, including the presence of people. Therefore, it is highly recommended to position the wireless antenna a minimum of 9.8ft (3m) above audiences to ensure optimum and reliable wireless operation.

DMX SETUP

DMX-512: DMX is short for Digital Multiplex. This is a universal protocol that is used as a form of communication between intelligent fixtures and controllers. A DMX controller sends DMX data instructions from the controller to the fixture. DMX data is sent as serial data that travels from fixture to fixture via the DATA "IN" and DATA "OUT" XLR terminals located on all DMX fixtures (most controllers only have a DATA "OUT" terminal).

DMX Linking: DMX is a language allowing all makes and models of different manufacturers to be linked together and operate from a single controller, as long as all fixtures and the controller are DMX compliant. To ensure proper DMX data transmission, try to use the shortest cable path possible when linking several DMX fixtures together. The order in which fixtures are connected in a DMX line does not influence the DMX addressing. For example, a fixture assigned a DMX address of 1 may be placed anywhere in a DMX line: at the beginning, at the end, or anywhere in the middle. When a fixture is assigned a DMX address of 1, the DMX controller knows to send DATA assigned to address 1 to that unit, no matter where it is located in the DMX chain.


Data Cable (DMX Cable) Requirements (For DMX Operation): This device can be controlled via DMX-512 protocol, with 3 controllable DMX channels, as detailed in the DMX Traits section of this manual. The DMX address is set on the back panel of the fixture. Your unit and your DMX controller require a standard 3-pin XLR connector for data input and data output (Figure 1). We recommend Accu-Cable DMX cables. If you are making your own cables, be sure to use standard 110-120 Ohm shielded cable (This cable may be purchased at almost all pro lighting stores). Your cables should be made with a male XLR connector at one end and a female XLR connector at the other. Also remember that DMX cable must be daisy chained and cannot be split.






DMX SETUP

Notice: Be sure to follow figures two and three when making your own cables. Do not use the ground lug on the XLR connector. Do not connect the cable's shield conductor to the ground lug or allow the shield conductor to come in contact with the XLR's outer casing. Grounding the shield could cause a short circuit and erratic behavior.



Special Note: Line Termination. When longer runs of cable are used, you may need to use a terminator on the last unit to avoid erratic behavior. A terminator is a 110-120 ohm 1/4 watt resistor which is connected between pins 2 and 3 of a male XLR connector (DATA + and DATA -). This unit is inserted in the female XLR connector of the last unit in your daisy chain to terminate the line. Using a cable terminator (ADJ part number Z-DMX/T) will decrease the chances of erratic behavior.



A DMX512 terminator reduces signal errors, avoiding most signal reflection interference. Connect PIN 2 (DMX-) and PIN 3 (DMX+) of the last fixture in series with a 120 Ohm, 1/4 W Resistor to terminate the DMX512.

5-Pin XLR DMX Connectors. Some manufacturers use 5-pin DMX-512 data cables for DATA transmission in place of 3-pin. 5-pin DMX fixtures may be implemented in a 3-pin DMX line by using a cable adapter, which can readily be found at most electronics stores. The chart below details a proper cable conversion.

DMX SETUP

All fixtures should be given a DMX starting address when using a DMX controller, so the correct fixture responds to the correct control signal. This digital starting address is the channel number from which the fixture starts to "listen" to the digital control signal sent out from the DMX controller. The assignment of this starting DMX address is achieved by setting the correct DMX address on the digital control display on the fixture.

You can set the same starting address for all fixtures or a group of fixtures, or set different addresses for each individual fixture. Setting all fixtures to the same DMX address will cause all fixtures to react in the same way, in other words, changing the settings of one channel will affect all the fixtures simultaneously.

If you set each fixture to a different DMX address, each unit will start to "listen" to the channel number you have set, based on the quantity of DMX channels of each fixture. That means changing the settings of one channel will only affect the selected fixture. For example, when operating this 3-channel unit, you should set the starting DMX address of the first unit to 1, the second unit to 4 (1 + 3), the third unit to 7 (1 + 3 + 3), etc...

GOBO REPLACEMENT


The gobo in this device can be interchanged at any time, allowing the user to customize the system. To replace gobo, follow the steps below:

- 1. Locate the gobo housing in front of the top framing blade, then gently slide the gobo housing out of the top of unit.
- 2. Use a pair of needle nose pliers to carefully remove the retaining ring that holds the gobo in the gobo housing.
- 3. Remove and replace the gobo with the desired replacement. Reinsert the retainer ring, making sure the ring rests firmly against the gobo.
- 4. Slide the gobo assembly back into place.


ADDING A COLOR GEL

A color gel (not included) can be added to the front of this unit and can be interchanged at any time. This allows the user to customize the system. To add a color gel, follow the steps below:

- 1. Locate the color gel frame at the front of the unit. Slide the spring lever back and slide the gel frame out of the holder.
- 2. Once the gel frame has been removed, slide your desired color gel into the middle of the frame.
- 3. Slide the spring back and slide the gel frame into place.



FUSE REPLACEMENT

Disconnect the unit from its power source. Remove the power cord from the unit, then find the fuse holder located inside the power socket. Use a philips-head screw driver to remove the fuse holder, then remove the bad fuse and replace with a new one of the same rating (T1A).

POWER LINKING

This feature allows multiple units to be linked together by way of the power input and output sockets.

The maximum number of devices that can be connected in this manner is as follows:

14 units maximum @ 120V.

24 units maximum @ 230V

After this quantity has been reached, a new power outlet must be used to accommodate additional devices.

Linked devices must be of the same make and model type. DO NOT mix devices!

TROUBLE SHOOTING

Below is a common problem that the user may encounter, with possible solutions.

No light output from the fixture:

- Check that the fuse has not blown. The fuse is located on the rear panel of the fixture.
- Check that the 4 framing blades are not in the closed position.

CLEANING


Due to fog residue, smoke, and dust, cleaning of the internal and external optical lenses must be carried out periodically in order to optimize light output.


- Use normal glass cleaner and a soft cloth to wipe down the outside casing.
- Clean the external optics with glass cleaner and a soft cloth.
- Always be sure to dry all parts completely before plugging the unit back in.

Cleaning frequency depends on the environment in which the fixture operates (i.e. smoke, fog residue, dust, dew).


